

Believe it or not Halloween will be here soon. If you have a great Halloween costume, wear it to the meeting – we are never too old to have fun.



#### **MUMMY DOGS**



#### What you need:

**Hot Dogs** Crescent roll dough Edible eyes – this candy is optional but it really makes it fun looking Mustard / Ketchup for dipping

- **Preheat the oven** to 375 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Unroll the crescent roll dough- do not separate at perforations. Press the perforations to create a rectangle.
- With a knife cut each rectangle lengthwise into 10 pieces of dough. You will have a total of 40 pieces when you are done.
- Wrap 4 pieces of sliced dough around each hot dog to look like "bandages", stretching the dough slightly to fit the hot dogs. Leave some space so you can see the hot dog's face. Remember the dough will slightly puff up when baked so make sure there's some room.
- Place each wrapped hot dog on an ungreased large cookie sheet.
- Bake for 10-12 minutes or until the dough is lightly golden brown and hot dogs warmed through.
- Remove from the oven.
- Place two dots of mustard or ketchup where you created the space for the candy eyeballs. Then place candy eyeballs on top of the mustard or ketchup.
- Serve immediately.

#### **Laundry Sheets:**

The liquidless laundry detergent sheets we tested last year are still not available in stores, but, you can buy them online. With all the environmental issues with plastic problems today, the big question is why aren't they sold in stores?

#### Forest Fires:

I don't have to tell you that California is in a fire crisis. Acres upon acres of fires have taken our much-needed forests. Forests contain the Biodiversity which is essential for the processes that support all life, including humans. They pump out oxygen and absorb carbon dioxide, a big deal to our ecosystem. They help stop soil erosion and flooding. We need to replant our national forests!

#### Penny Pines:

Let me reiterate how important the Penny Pines Project is. With our funds, we help in the reforestation of our Pacific Southwest Region 5 forests. Which includes: Angeles, Cleveland, Eldorado, Inyo, Klamath, Lassen, Los Padres, Mendocino, Modoc, Plumas, San Bernardino, Sequoia, Shasta Trinity, Six Rivers, Stanislaus and Tahoe National Forests.

Our donated monies contribute to Penny Pines Reforestation Program for their multiuse management, i.e. to prepare plantation sites for new trees, planting seedlings grown in Forest Service's nurseries, maintain watershed protection, soil stabilization and forest stand improvement (FSI) which includes removing dead trees and undergrowth.


