## CHRISTINE TRUXAW 1ST VICE PRESIDENT & DEAN


There were several Community Service Events during September.

## Bikers Against Child Abuse: B.A.C.A.

For both the General Meeting and the Evening Section, the guest speaker was Lil Trout from the Orange County's chapter of Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA). She spoke of the mission of BACA, which is to empower and protect the children who have suffered from abuse.

She explained the Club will have an initial meeting with the child, invite them to voluntarily "join" the group by giving the child a backpack kit that comes with a teddy bear, with BACA love, as well as other comfort items such as a BACA blanket, and a "Kutte" (a biker's style vest) with the patches of the child will choose to personalize their Kutte. They also get to ride on the motorcycle with a BACA member.

If the child chooses to be part of the BACA family, they are assigned to 2 BACA members, who are on call 24 hours, specifically to their assigned child. They will also attend court with their assigned child, for moral and emotional support as they testify against their abuser. The BACA members are trained for a year before they can become advocates for the kids.

While they are all bikers who love to ride, and will even go across state lines to help other BACA Clubs, these are also hard working, every day people making a difference in a child's life.

#### **FULLERTON REMEMBERING 9/11**

This year will mark the 24<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 9/11. Scott Townley has held a 9/11 Memorial outside his home in Fullerton to honor every single person who died from the September 11<sup>th</sup> terrorists attacks. He has only missed one year due to Covid.

His home is located at 863 N. Woods Avenue, near Golden Hill Elementary, and was covered with crosses memorializing each firefighter and police officer who perished, flags for every civilian with their name and location of death printed, and a memorial wall with photos of those who died at the Twin Towers.

On September 6, we had members from our Club help with the set-up. It was labor intensive, putting down flags and other decorations.

On September 11, there was a 9/11 Memorial service with the Fullerton PD Honor Guard and with a Bagpiper.
