President's Message Continued



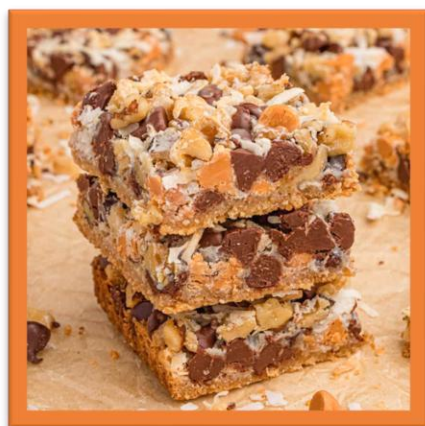

Seven Layer Bars - Submitted by Suzanne Photakis

Ingredients: Butter, Graham Cracker Crumbs, Semi Sweet Chocolate Chips, Butterscotch Chips, Flaked Coconut, Chopped Walnuts, Condensed milk

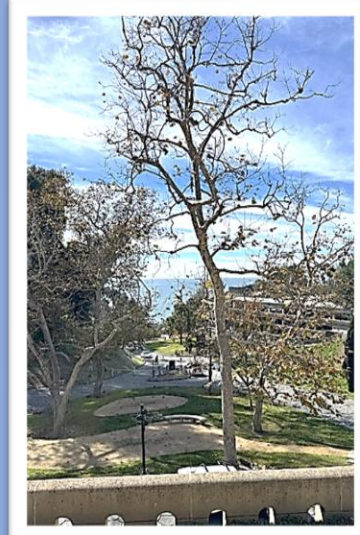


1/4 cup butter, melted and spread in a 9 x 13 pan
 Sprinkle over pan 1 1/4 cup graham cracker crumbs, pat down
 Add layer 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
 Add layer 1 cup butterscotch chips
 Add layer 1 cup flaked coconut
 Add layer 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
 Drizzle 1 can Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk over the top
 Bake 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes

Cookies are done when the top is just starting to turn golden brown
 Cool, cut in bars. Makes about 20 squares.

Mosaic with Achilles and Briseis

Roman, AD 100–300
Stone and glass

Enough remains of this scene to identify it as an episode from Homer's *Iliad*: the moment when Briseis—a royal woman captured by the Greek hero Achilles as a war prize—is taken from him to be given to Agamemnon, king of Mycenae. Briseis, in the center, is led away by two heralds, Talthylbus and Eurybates, who wear traveler's hats and carry staffs at far right. Achilles, resting his arm on a lyre and seated next to his companion Patroclus, watches from the left. The older, bearded man beside Briseis may be Achilles's tutor, Phoenix, or King Nestor of Pylos.

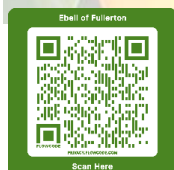
